Over the span of his visual arts career, he has accumulated extensive and multifaceted credentials as gallery director, curator, arts administrator and professional artist.

Graduating from the Nova Scotia College of Art in 1967 he began his arts administration and curatorial career in 1970.

Positions in visual art organizations have included CEO and senior management positions in a variety of administrator, curator, project manager and consultant roles from 1970 to present.

His experience has been national in scope having lived and worked professionally in 5 provinces.

He has served on various municipal, provincial and national cultural boards, committees and juries and chaired regional art gallery associations in eastern and western Canada. (ex: Canadian Museums Association, Canadian Art Museum Directors Organization, Canadian Conference for the Arts, Canada Council for the Arts, Atlantic Provinces Art Gallery Association, Western Canada Art Association, Alberta Foundation for the Arts, Saskatchewan Arts Council, Toronto International Festival, etc.)

The leadership roles he has served in throughout his career has informed and enhanced his credentials, resulting in a seniority of experience and hands on knowledge in the workings of art museum senior management responsibilities and organizational oversight: budget preparation and management, program development and funding, collection stewardship and enhancement, staff relations and supervision, trustee relations and community communications.
